New Books for and about Children:

Children in Fear...A book about the fears we teach children and what parents can teach them instead. Written by a well known lecturer and teacher Stephen M. Joseph.

A child's eye view...invaluable for teachers particularly in the field of mathematics and science, and fascinating for the ever-increasing number of young parents trying to understand the developmental psychology of their own children. A CHILD'S EYE VIEW, examines the important implications of Piaget's theories. BASED on work carried out in the last eight years of Chorley College by Mary Sime and a team of her colleagues and students, the book begins by outlining the fundamental tenets of Piaget about a childs intellectual growth and basic concept development, and describes the re -actions of primary school children to some of the tests. The second section illustrates the paths by which young children learn to reason logically, while the third explores the progress of logical thinking as the child matures into the adolescent and the adult.
