

Fossil specimens, maps, short films and written explanations guide the visitor through the exhibit. This Museumobile demonstrates dramatically the history of Ontario and the vital role fossils play in the documentation of past events.

The third Museumobile "Man in Ontario - the first I2,000 years" is the story, in broadest terms, of man from the time he first arrived in Ontario. Artifacts - tools and implements, and printed material outline the story from the Paleo Indians, who followed the retreat of the glacial ice into Ontario some I2,000 to I3,000 years ago, through the Historic or Fur Trade period, about I600.

The Royal Ontario Museum's Museumobiles are designed so that they may be driven into a community, the door opened and the Museum, or a part of it, is there ready to be viewed.

The Museumobile will be in Terrace Bay on Friday, July 19th at the Curling Rink parking lot.
