**SWIM POOL:**

Swimming lessons for the month will end on July 29th. Tuesday, July 30th will be testing day for Tadpoles, Minnows, Pre Beginners, Beginners, Survival and Junior Artificial Respiration as well as pre-testing for Juniors, Intermediates and Seniors. These will be conducted at regular class times. Red Cross testing will take place Wednesday, July 31st. Times will be posted at the pool. Your child must pass the pre-test in order to take the Red Cross Exam. All children must pay a 25¢ service fee before they can take their test. Please be sure your child brings the correct amount.

Registration for the month of August will take place on Thursday and Friday afternoon of this week ONLY at the pool. No late registrations will be accepted. There is a registration fee of \$1.00 per child or \$2.50 per family for the month.

This Saturday, July 27th, the Red Rock swim team will be in town to challenge our local swimmers. It all begins at 10 in the morning and is open to the public free of charge.
