SCHREIBER DETACHMENT OPP PRESS RELEASE

On July 2Ist, I974 a Quebec man lost his life as a result of a head on collision on Hwy. #I7 at Jackfish. Dead is Wayne Melvin VISCA, age 25 of Alymer, Quebec. Injured in the accident was the deceased wife, and occupants of the other vehicle operated by John Henry ROSS of Marathon, Ontario. Both vehicles were completely destroyed by the violent impact.

Two other minor collisions were investigated by detachment personnel both involving wild life. The first occurred on the morning of July 26th, I974, when Carmen GROULX of Windsor, Ontario was confronted by a bear which chose to cross the road in front of the vehicle causing approximately \$300.00 damage to the front of the GROULX vehicle.

A deer crossing in front of a Thunder Bay vehicle operated by Gordon ELLIS resulted in approximately \$150.00 to the side of the vehicle.

Motorists are once again cautioned to pay particular attention for wild life when travelling along the north shore. Serious injury and thousands of dollars of damage have been witness to the fact that motorists do not believe wild life cross highways.

An object floating in Lake Superior off of St. Ignace and the main land prompted a search by O.P.P. Personnel aided by the Ministry of Natural Resources. The sighting was made by CPR employees from an eastbound train and is possibly linked with a missing person presently being investigated by Nipigon Detachment. A thorough search of the lake and shore line revealed nothing. That investigation is continuing.

A theft of boat and motor valued at \$500.00 from Whitesand Lake is also being investigated. Theft occurred between July I2th and 22nd, I974 and boat is described as I5 ft. aluminum with "Gun Mountain Lodge" printed on side and an old 5½ h.p. Johnson outboard. Any information regarding this occurrence will be treated as confidential.
