

REGIONAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE FORMED

On June 17, 1974, the Hon. Leo Bernier, Minister of Natural Resources formally appointed the Regional Advisory Committee for the north central region. This committee results from the recent reorganization of the Ministry of Natural Resources and is a continuation of the former District Advisory Committees which were in existence prior to 1973.

In advising the regional director, Mr. R.A. Baxter of Thunder Bay, the committee will be considering a wide variety of issues and aspects of resource management. At the request of the regional director, the committee:

- (i) Shall advise on the development and modification of a land use plan for the region or any part thereof, which plan will provide policy guidelines for the development, use and management of natural resources therein;
- (ii) May review periodically land use plans and the policy guidelines for zones, and recommend changes thereof;
- (iii) May consider any matters affecting the use of public lands and waters and make recommendations concerning such use;
- (iv) May consider and make recommendations on any matters dealing with the activities of the Ministry.

The new committee, representing a cross-section of people and interests throughout the region is composed of twelve members and will be chaired by Mrs. Hilda M. Holm of Geraldton. Active on the committee with Mrs. Holm will be Mr. Martin Bannon of Thunder Bay, Dr. Mel Bartley of Thunder Bay, Mr. Sydney Hancock of Atikokan, Mr. John Poleschuk of Thunder Bay, Mr. Thomas Bagdon of White River, Mr. Mervin Pennock of Nakina, Mr. John Ryder of Thunder Bay, Mr. Brian Honan of Marathon, Mr. Thomas Inglis of Thunder Bay, Mr. Lloyd Lein of Nipigon and Mr. Leslie Mitchelson of Thunder Bay. They will be ably assisted by Mr. James Foulds (NDP) Port Arthur, Mr. Bernt Gilbertson (PC) Algoma, Mr. James Jessiman (PC) Fort William, Mr. T. Patrick Reid (L) Rainy River, and Mr. Jack E. Stokes (NDP) Thunder Bay, all of whom are keenly interested and concerned with the sound management of the natural resources in the region.

The committee is one of four to be named across Northern Ontario, one being located in each of the ministries northern administrative regions. It is expected that once operational, the committee will be meeting at different locations throughout the region and will be accepting public briefs or other input as regards the activities of the ministry in this area.

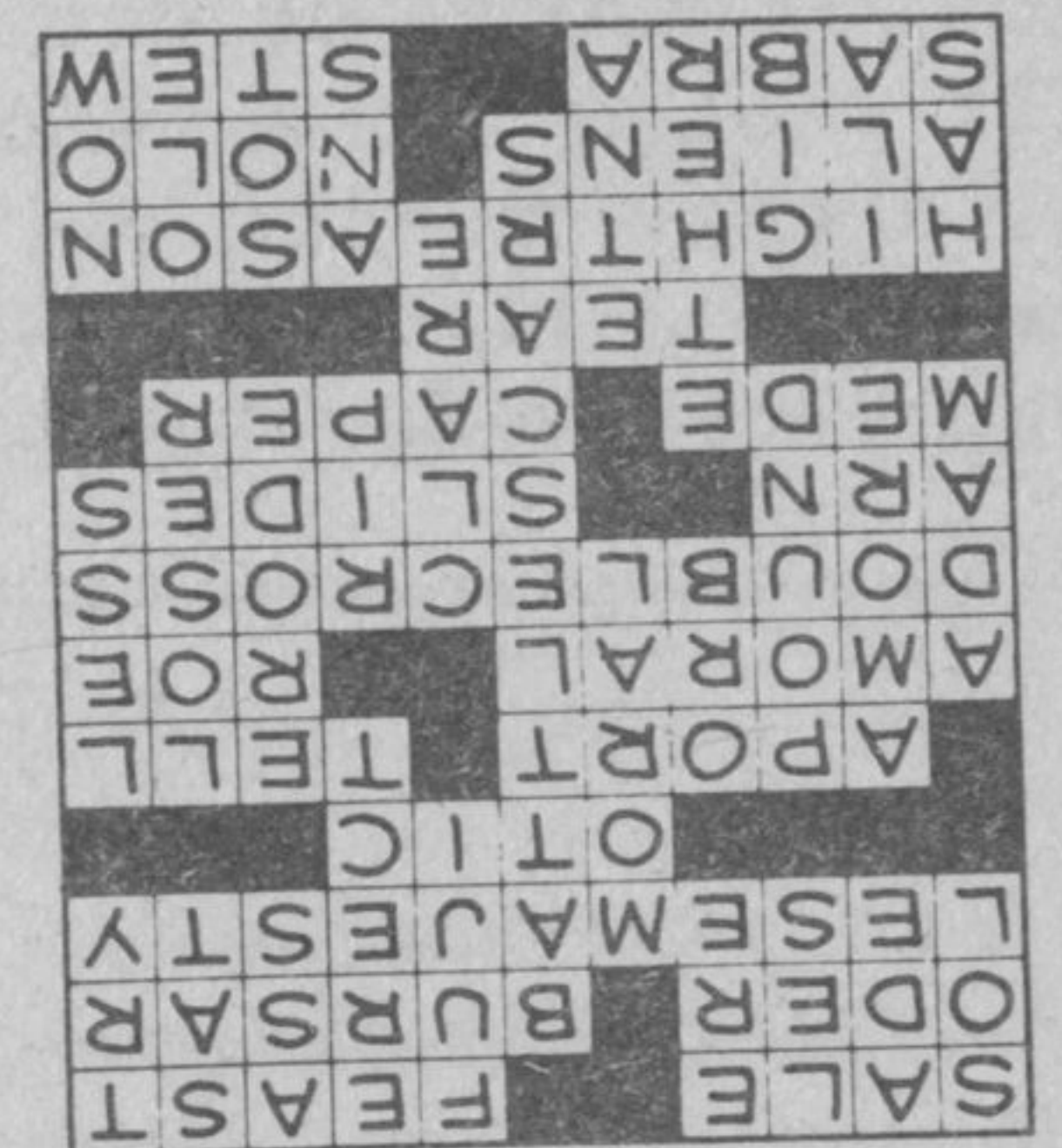
ENGAGEMENT ANNOUNCEMENT
