A very tragic accident occurred I.9 miles east of Terrace Bay on August 14th, 1974, at 7:50 a.m. Erik Knud BYRGESEN, age 28 and his wife Linda, age 22 of Calgary, Alta. were killed in the two vehicle collision when their eastbound vehicle collided head on with a westbound car driven by Ronald Leslie HOWARD, 19 years of I7 Hurdman Rd., Ottawa, Ont. HOWARD and a passenger in his car, Frank BARATTA, 23 also of Ottawa were admitted to McCausland Hospital in Terrace Bay and are in satisfactory condition. Mr. and Mrs. BYRGESEN were on their honeymoon after being married on August 10th, 1974. HOWARD has been charged with Criminal Negligence as a result of the accident and will appear in Provincial Court, Schreiber at a later date. Both vehicles were completely demolished in the accident.

On Saturday, August 17th, 1974, a vehicle driven by Deborah DYKE of Port Perry, Ontario went out of control on Highway 17 at Walkers Lake, Schreiber. The vehicle struck a sign post and roller over causing \$1200.00 damage. Miss DYKE and a passenger Paul SKINNER of Prince Albert, Ontario suffered cuts and bruises.
