AMBULANCE SERVICE QUESTIONED

Statement by Ian Deans, MPP for Wentworth, New Democratic Party.

I have today sent the following letter to the Minister of Health:

"Dear Mr. Minister:

I am requesting that a full enquiry be made into the ambulance services being conducted by the province. In particular, full public disclosure of the level of ambulance service, together with whatever provisions are available for back-up service, must be made, also the methods of financing what are primarily independent operations should be reviewed. It is my understanding from investigations I have conducted that while the initial approval of the budgets of ambulance operators is the responsibility of the government of Ontario, there is virtually no audit or mechanism for checking the actual expenditures.
