THE ERIE CANAL COST \$7,143,789, AND SOON EARNED ITS PRICE MANY TIMES OVER. IT WAS 363 MILES LONG AND LINKED THE WATERS OF THE EASTERN U.S. WITH THE WEST. THE BOATS WERE PULLED BY HORSES AT ABOUT 1½ MILES AN HR.
