An outdoor boy, Jamie enjoys camping, fishing, canoeing and boating. He is also fond of crafts and woodworking.

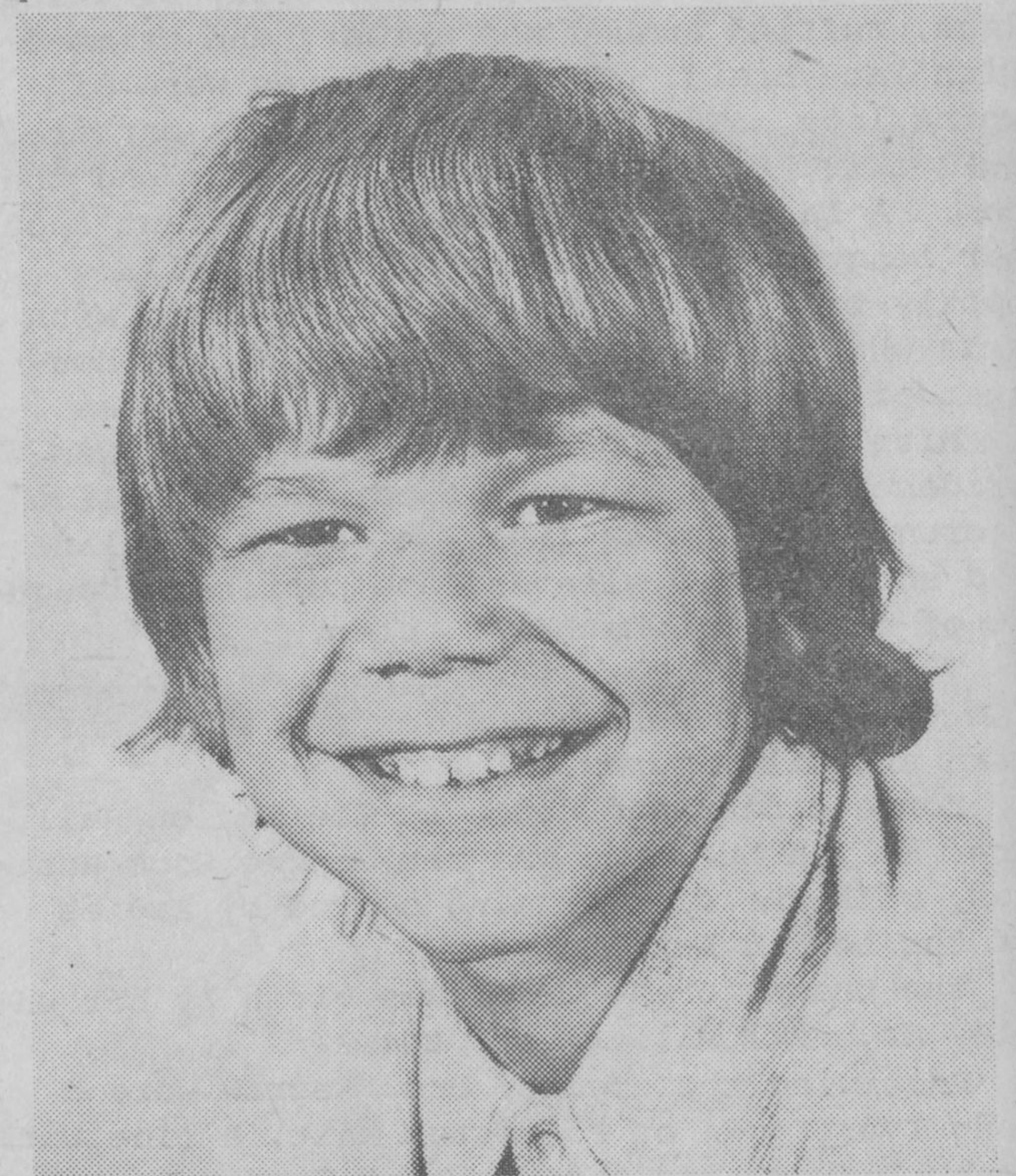
