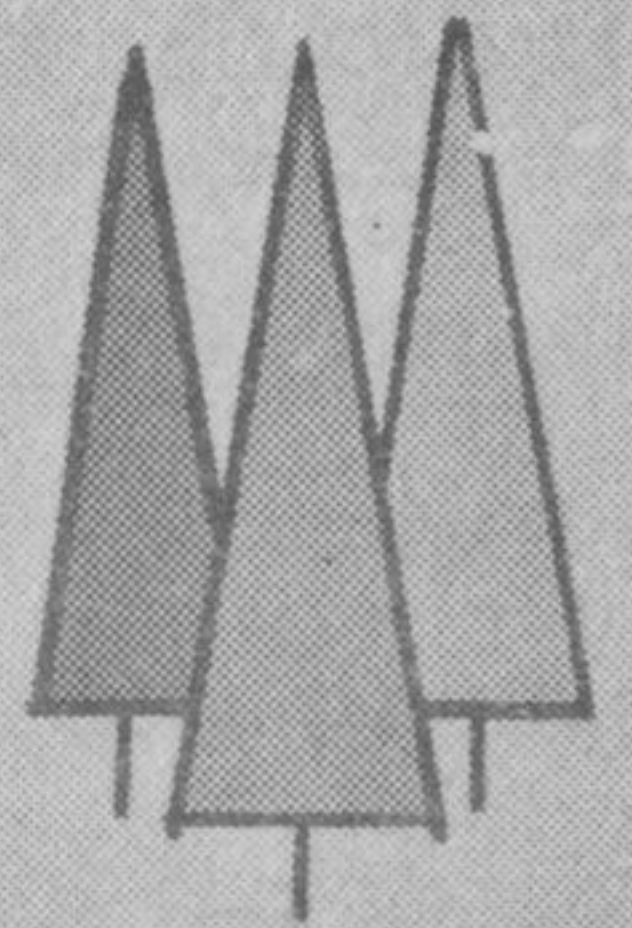

TERRACE BAY COUNCIL QUOTES

J. Hale acted as Reeve for the Council meeting held on September 10th, in the absence of R. Bray. Councillors Helmink and Megraw and W. Hanley, Clerk Treasurer, attended.

Correspondence included a reply to a local citizen regarding a request for a Phase 4 lot, advising him that when roads and hydro services were completed, his application would be considered.

The Ministry of Health have been given permission to use the Dentists office as a temporary measure.

A letter from the Board of McCausland Hospital advised Council they will share the content of planning study.

Mr. D. Baron thanked Council for hosting a dinner, along with Schreiber Council, in honour of the Young Voyageur Program.

A motion was given a first, second and third reading and finally passed, to submit questions to the electors under Section 73 (I) of the Liquor Licence Act, at the Municipal elections in December, regarding the sale of liquor under a Dining Lounge licence, and under a Lounge licence.

Accounts passed for payment were as follows: Township \$43,784.81; Hydro \$13,637.79; Library \$1,634.33 and Recreation Committee \$14,124.09.
