These Were the Winnahs!

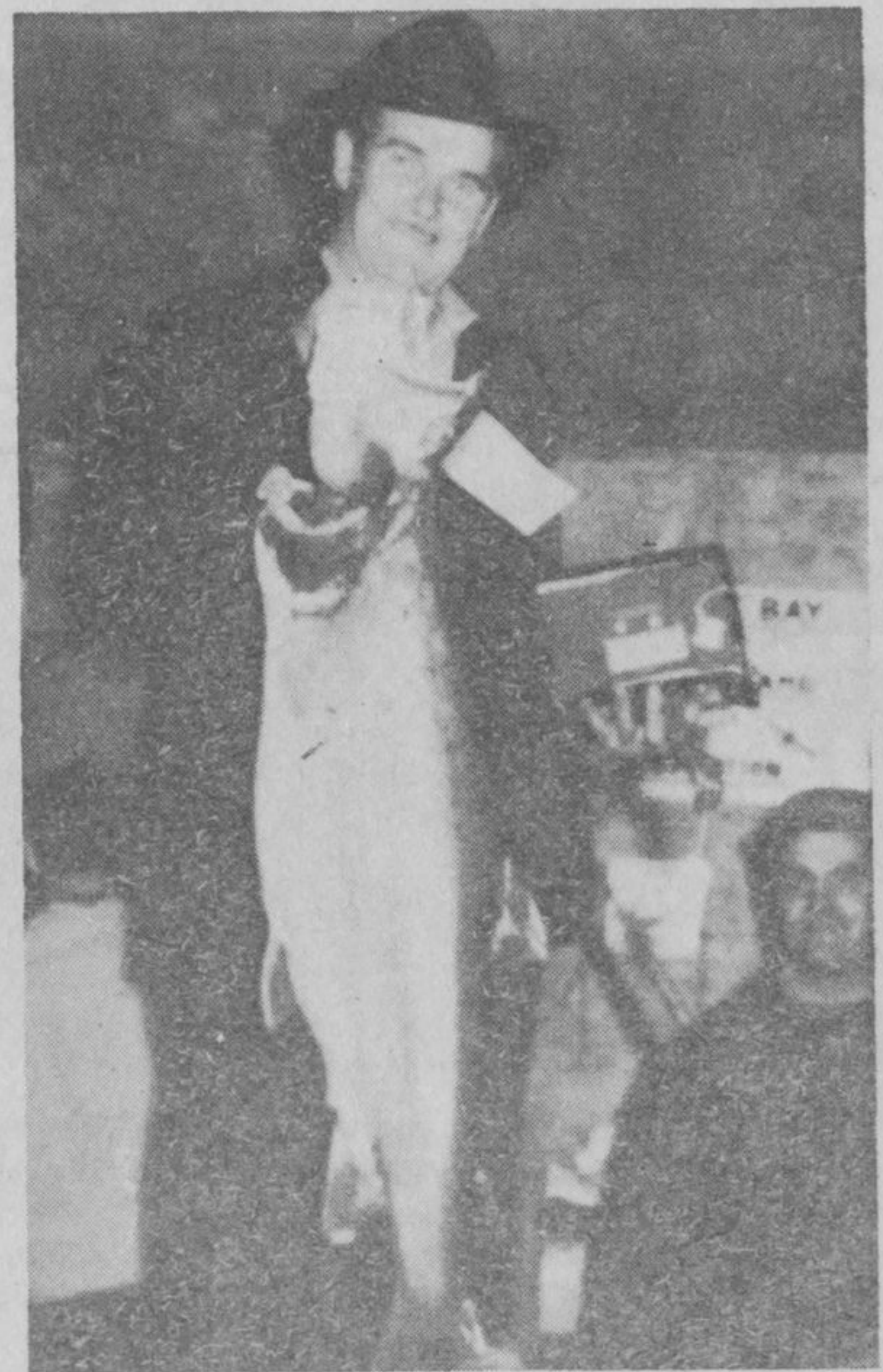
