## STOKES WRITES MINISTER OF HEALTH

The Honourable Frank Miller Minister of Health Hepburn Block - Queen's Park Toronto, Ontario.

Dear Mr. Minister

I am writing on behalf of the people residing in the Terrace Bay/Schreiber area and in particular the Board of Directors of McCausland Hospital who have been actively negotiating with your Ministry in an effort to offer an adequate level of health services.

A proposal was submitted to Dr. J.C. Baldwin, regional coordinator of health services on April 9th, 1974 and formal approval was received in July.

Since that time Kimberly Clark has announced a \$200 million expansion to their forest products facility in Terrace Bay which will employ an additional 200 permanent workers while the construction work force, over a two to three year period, will number I,200 to I,400. The original proposal proved for I8 beds in this new health facility which will be obviously inadequate to serve an expanded population. We feel very strongly that much needed expansion should be incorporated into this new structure now rather than have to effect furth -er construction at greater cost within a year or two.

I think the Board of Directors of McCausland Hospital are wise in their efforts to plan for the future in an efficient and realistic manner and I respectfully urge you to assist in every way possible to help them in their efforts to provide for present and future health needs.

Your interest and concern in this most important program will be greatly appreciated.


zone.
