for the TOWNSHIP of TERRACE BAY; of which

all Electors are hereby required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly, and further take notice that the manner in which said nominations shall be filed is set forth in section 34 of *The Municipal Elections Act* which provides that:

34.-(1) A person may be nominated as a candidate for an office by filing in the office of the clerk, during the normal office hours of the clerk within the period in which nominations may be filed, a nomination paper in prescribed form which:
(a) shall be signed by at least ten electors whose names are entered in the polling lists of electors entitled to vote in an election to such office;
(b) shall state the name, occupation and address of the person nominated in such manner as will identify him and the office for which he is nominated; and
(c) shall state the name and address of each elector signing the nomination paper and, where the office for which the person is nominated is a member of a school board, that such nominator is a public school elector or a separate school elector, as the fact is. 1974, s.20(1).
(2) No nomination is valid unless there is filed with the nomination paper a consent in writing to the nomination and a declaration of qualification in the prescribed form by the person nominated.

(3) A nomination paper nominating a person for an office the holder of which is required to be elected by public school electors shall be signed by public school electors only. 1974, s.20(2).
(4) A nomination paper nominating a person for an office the holder of which is required to be elected by separate school electors shall be signed by separate school electors only. 1974, s.20(3).
(5) Each candidate for election to an office shall be nominated by a separate nomination paper, but an elector may sign the nomination papers of different candidates.
(6) After a nomination paper is filed with the clerk it shall remain in the possession of the clerk.
(7) The onus is on the person nominated for election to an office to file a *bona fide* nomination paper.

If a greater number of candidates than required to fill the said offices, are nominated and make the required declarations, notice of the time for the holding of the poll, including the advance poll and notice of the last day for making applications for a certificate to vote by proxy will be given forthwith.
