

SCHREIBER COUNCIL QUOTES

Schreiber Municipal Council's October 16th meeting was a lengthy one, with full council present and Reeve H.J. McParland presiding.

Councillor J.S. Caccamo, expressed the concern felt by all over the condition of town streets and apparent lack of effort on the part of Northeastern Construction Co. in restoring torn out sumps and applying crushed gravel.

It was agreed to request the Ministry of Environment to stop sewer pipe laying and to concentrate on sumps, drain culverts and pipe and restoration of streets, and to notify Northeastern Co. of council's action.

The Reeve reported the final design of the new dam at Cooks' Lake and contract documents will not be ready until the latter part of November.

Schreiber Hydro forwarded minutes of a meeting with representatives of Ontario Hydro and the Commission - Schreiber Hydro intends to employ Ontario Hydro for all repairs and renovations and inquire into the possibility of applying the supervision charge of 30 cents per customer per month placing Ontario Hydro on a retainer service basis.

After studying a report from the Municipalities of Ontario re Bell Canada hearings, council accepted a levy of one cent per capita as Schreiber's cost of the hearings, endorsing a resolution of the Association requesting the

Ontario Provincial government and the federal government to provide a more sensitive system for regulation of Bell Canada in Ontario.

In negotiations for purchase of property adjacent to the arena council refused a counter offer and re-stated their original offer, requesting that the fire-gutted building be torn down for safety reasons within a reasonable time.

The Chimo Club's request to have the back stairway at the Club replaced was granted - the work to be done as soon as possible.

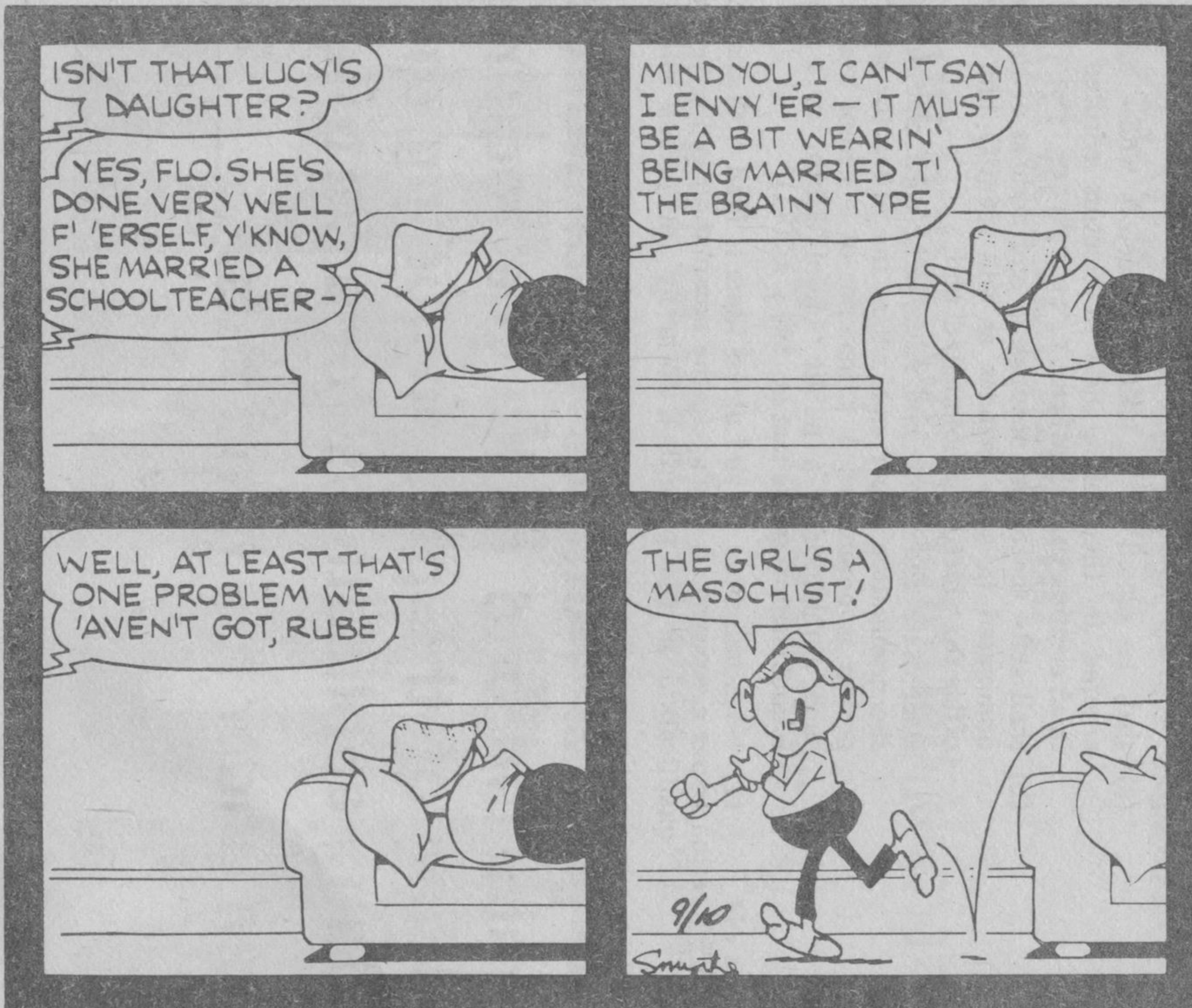
The public library board, by letter, requested as much space as possible within the town hall, in order that they may expand their services - the present quarters hopelessly crowded.

The Citizens' Rink Committee notified that Rodney Bryson will be the manager this season; adding that William Campbell is the committee president and Reg Bailey, the secretary-treasurer.

Marathon Realty's offer to sell triangle of land, required by the town for twelve cents a square foot - approximately \$1531.56 was accepted.

Copies of letters to Jack Stokes, MLA from C.P. Rail, and from Dr. R.E. Feasby, D.D.S, Sr. Dental Consultant, Ministry of Health were read.
