Dr. Bloom is expected to set up a dental practice in Terrace Bay and council will contact her regarding facilities in Schreiber in the Medical Centre which is expected to be ready for occupancy in November.

Minutes of the Thunder Bay Board Homes for the Aged and Lake Superior Board of Education, were read and filed.

General accounts of \$2,789.52 and Water accounts of \$4,640.88 were approved for payment.

By-Law 562, re the Medical Centre was given final reading; By-Law 565, re the new dam was given first and second reading; By-Law 566, re installation of sewers on Winnipeg St. was given first and second reading; and By-Law 564, re appointment of clerk-treasurer was passed.

After a lengthy discussion on the use of the town hall for stag parties it was decided that in future renters will be informed the hall must close at 2 a.m. The rates have been changed to \$25.00 an evening until 12.01 and from then until 2 a.m. time and a half for caretaker's wages plus 15¢ on overtime.
