The date of April 7, 1975 was approved for the 1975 Annual Meeting of the Hospital Corporation which will be held in Schreiber. Membership Fees will remain at \$1.00 per person.

An election to fill the position of Vice-President of the Board was held. Bernie McCracken was elected as Vice-President, replacing Barry Stephen who recently resigned from the Board.

The Hospital By-Laws regarding Auxiliary representation on the Board was reviewed. A resolution was approved to amend the By-Laws so that the Auxiliary President or a designate thereof could be the Auxiliary representative on the Board. This amendment must now be approved by the membership at the Annual Meeting.

A local Travel Policy was approved. A new salary scale for the position of Director of Nursing was also approved. A resolution was passed to approve expenses for a Development Committee Study Group visit to the new hospital in Red Lake.

Accounts for September, 1974 in the total amount of \$25,769.91 were passed for payment.

Under new business the Administrator reported on the Notice of Application for Union Certification received from the Ontario Labor Relations Board. No word had been received as yet regarding the outcome of the application before the O.L.R.B.

A request to purchase a new electric typewriter for the Administration Office was approved.

The next regular meeting was scheduled for Tuesday, November 19th, 1974 in the basement of the Schreiber Municipal Building.
