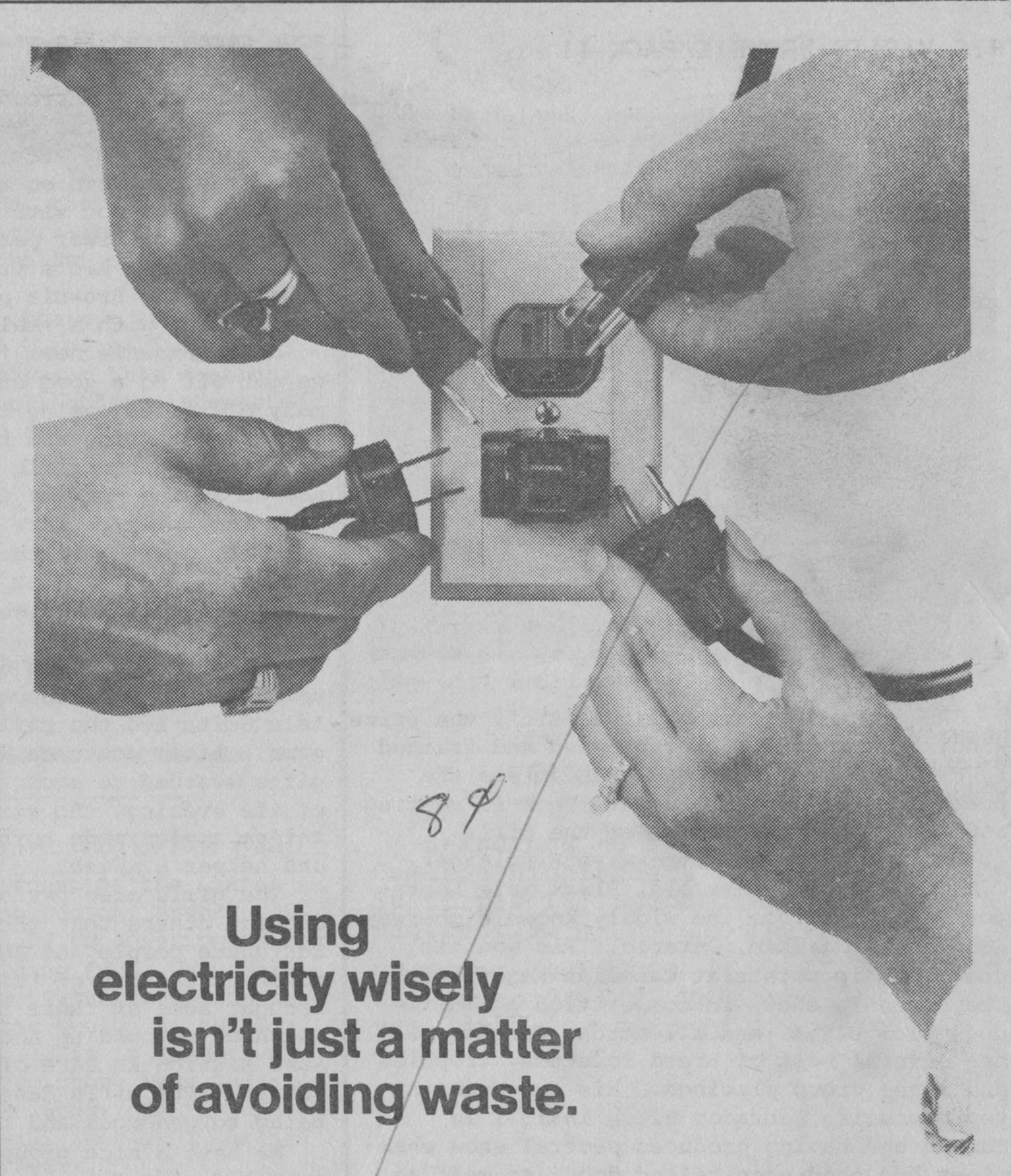
A thank you card was received from Anne Tod-esco.
