LIQUOR LICENCE VOTE

After lengthy correspondence with the Liquor Licence Board of Ontario the municipality has to vote on whether or not Terrace Bay will have liquor.

There are two (2) ballots which will be cast on December 2nd in the municipal election for liquor. One ballot will state "Are you in favour of the sale of liquor under a dining lounge licence for consumption on licenced premises with food available, while the other states "Are you in favour of the sale of liquor under a lounge licence for consumption on licensed premises".

In order for these two votes to be accepted 3/5 (60%) of those casting ballots must be in favour. By verbal confirmation from the lawyers of the Liquor Licence Board of Ontario it was stated the existing club licences, beer and wine licenses and the operation of the Liquor Control Board outlet would not be affected by a negative vote.
