say "WE ALL CAN'T BE WRONG," Statistics prove us out.

We strongly urge that steps be taken at once to rectify this, and that the carloads of paper and red tape that governments are noted for, be pushed aside in order that they can deal with the gravity of the situation.

I would not hesitate for one minute to say that if this same situation applied any where in Ontario east of Sudbury, there would have been immediate highway projects started to rectify this situation, but we on the north-shore have always been regarded as second-class citizens; hence the lack of any action from the government.

This problem is on the Trans Canada Highway No. 17, this is not some secondary bush road, I am speaking about! Signs and warning lights will do no good.

One more thing that irkes me to no end is the lack of guts on the insurance companies, who have paid out many thousands of dollars in claims over the last two years, only last October a \$45,000.00 transport upset, one half mile east of Schreiber and was a total wreck.

They have money and power! Are they afraid of the Government? Why do they not make a stand?, and have this situation fixed instead of paying the claims of the vehicles that are wrecked and the lives that are lost; and rais-

ing our premiums to take care of the increased costs of payments made.

I take full responsibility in having this letter sent to the news media for publication, I Hope this will waken us all up and start things moving in the right direction.!!
