**TERRACE BAY POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT**

Forty-two occurrences were investigated by the Terrace Bay Police Department during the period December 22nd through January 5th.

On December 22nd the fraudulent use of a credit card was reported. On December 25th Doreen's Snack Bar at the Recreation Centre was broken into and property valued at over \$700. was reported stolen. A male subject was later arrested and charged with Break, Enter and Theft. The theft of a motor vehicle was reported on December 28th. It was later recovered and no charges were laid. On January 3rd two men from New York were charged with fraudulent use of a stolen credit card. The theft of gasoline was reported on January 4th and is under investigation.

On January 4th the theft of a motorized snow vehicle was reported and one adult and one juvenile have been charged. Seven charges were laid against the operators of snow vehicles, and charges of careless driving and no insurance were laid under the Highway Traffic Act. Nine motor vehicles were safety checked and five warnings issued.

Numerous complaints have been received regarding the misuse of motorized snow vehicles. The following is published for the information of citizens:

- 1) all machines must be licensed. No matter where they are being operated.
  - 2) No person shall operate a machine on a highway unless he is the holder of an operators license.
  - 3) All machines must be insured before being operated on a highway.
- The operator of machines are requested not to run them at the following locations:
- a) school yards during classes
  - b) the hospital grounds or the Home for the Aged at any time
  - c) church grounds during services
