- Motorized Snow Vehicle Regulations - cont'd from page 11
2. The Ministry of Transport shall be notified within six days of any sale of a machine or change of address.
 3. No person shall drive a motorized snow vehicle on the King's highway or secondary road, including the shoulders, except to cross at 90 degrees.
 4. No person shall drive a motorized snow vehicle on a highway unless he is 16 years or older and is the holder of a driver's license.
 5. No person shall drive a motorized snow vehicle on a highway unless he is insured.
 6. Every person in charge of a motorized snow vehicle who is directly or indirectly involved in a collision shall, if the collision results in injury to any person or in damage to property in excess of \$100.00 report the collision forthwith to the nearest provincial or municipal police officer.
 7. No person shall drive a motorized snow vehicles faster than 15 MPH on any highway where the normal speed limit is 30 MPH or less, or faster than 30 MPH where the normal speed limit is greater than 30 MPH.
 8. No person shall drive a motorized snow vehicle which is towing a toboggan or sled except by means of a rigid tow bar.
 9. Every person who, knowingly or unknowingly trespasses on land while operating a motorized snow vehicle is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine not exceeding \$500.00.
