

BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING

The Superior Board of Education held a regular meeting on Saturday, January 25th on passing the minutes of Meeting No. Meeting No. 1/75.

Disbursements for the month of December totalled \$738,442.63.

Audited statement of revenue was presented to the Trustees, with H.J. Boudreau providing clarification of detail.

Statement of Capital Revenue Fund for the Replacement was presented to Trustees. H.J. Boudreau responding to questions on the floor.

Resolution No. 25 being a by-law to allow borrowing from time to time, from the Bank of Montreal, a promissory note a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of one hundred thousand dollars to meet, until such time as revenue has been received, the current expenditures of The Lake Superior Board of Education for the year 1975 was approved.

The Board decided to continue leasing an International Delta 88, or its equivalent, for the same purpose as its usage.

A request for payroll deductions was first discussed. The motion was put on the floor to be carried and subsequently voted upon and carried.

Mr. R. Acourt introduced the subject of the expansion of the Industrial Arts facilities at Terrace High School. Assisted by R. Ward, photographs and a ten minute video-tape presentation to the Board was presented with details of the plan for expansion, and provided with an opportunity for discussion of the topic.

The Board proceeded with a request for minutes approval and obtain cost estimates for the Industrial Arts expansion at Manitouwadge.

Ms. L. Conrad advised the Board that she had drawn her nomination for a teaching position with the Department of National Defence for 1975-77.

Correspondence on behalf of the staffs of Terrace High School, Marathon Public School, Terrace Superior High School and Lake Superior High School expressed appreciation to the Board for the implementation of the 1974 Staff-Board social.

A request was received from the Service Employees Union for a review of custodial salaries. The matter was referred to the Negotiating Committee for action. Mr. R. Acourt, Director of Education, R.A. Cressman, provided copies of the 1975 weighting factors released by the Ministry of Education.
