

AND SNOW VEHICLE ACT AMENDMENTS

amendments to the Motorized Snow Act concern several users of this recreational vehicle and the following are intended to inform you of some of the changes.

Approved helmets, such as those that comply with standards established for M/C Helmets must be worn by all snowmobile drivers, passengers and persons being towed. When towing a sledge, sloop or cutter a rigid tow bar must be used. Towing is not permitted on the highway or shoulder except to cross, and this provision does not apply to roads within a municipality where motorized snow vehicles are permitted.

Legislation dealing with the registering of snowmobiles has also changed. The dealer must register the machine and on purchase the title is merely transferred to the new owner. This is similar to the methods used for motor vehicles.

Previous legislation prohibited the operation of snowmobiles on the roadway portion of highways this has now been expanded to include the shoulder portion of the highway.

Speed limits have also been established for operation of snow vehicles on roads and trails (a trail established and maintained in whole or in part by public funds, where no such trail exists in this area), public recreation grounds (provisions have been made however, to cover sanctioned snowmobiles within parks and exhibition grounds).

The speed limits on a road is 30 mph where the maximum speeds for snow vehicles are less than 30 mph, where speeds are greater than 30 mph a 30 mph speed limit must be observed. Municipalities have the authority to vary these speeds provided the proper signs are posted.

Previous legislation has also been established for the identification of vehicles, registration and driving permits, however, these provisions will not come into effect until next season.

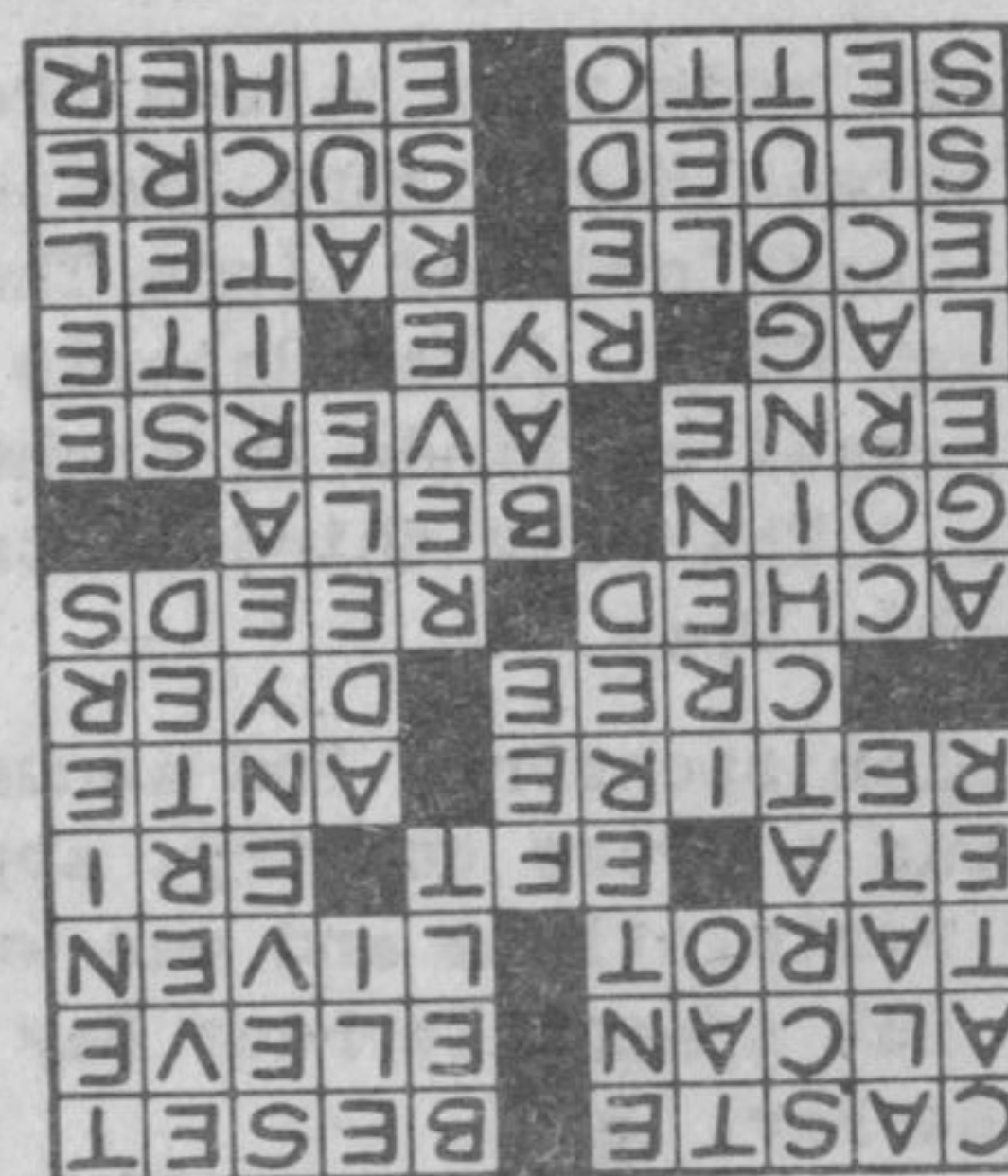
