Dear Sir:

As I survey the political scene at the lowest pecking level - School Board Trustees - the question that most readily comes to mind is "Is there no integrity"? Many a Board across the province has doubled its trustees' honorarium. With rare exceptions, they have the temerity to claim as a reason for this exploitation of the public purse, "everybody's doing it."

The Lake Superior Board of Education has just increased the honorarium per trustee by one hundred per cent to \$200 each per month, the maximum allowable under legislation, which has tripled the remuneration to its chairman (from \$100 to \$300 per month). Until this term of office every other chairman has received exactly the same as other trustees. However the additional is allowed by legislation. In addition, it has granted \$20 per meeting to those trustees on the Negotiating Committee. Adding to the above facts, a very generous non-taxable travel allowance, e.g. \$19 for a return trip Manitouwadge to Marathon
