## WORLD DAY OF PRAYER MARCH 7TH

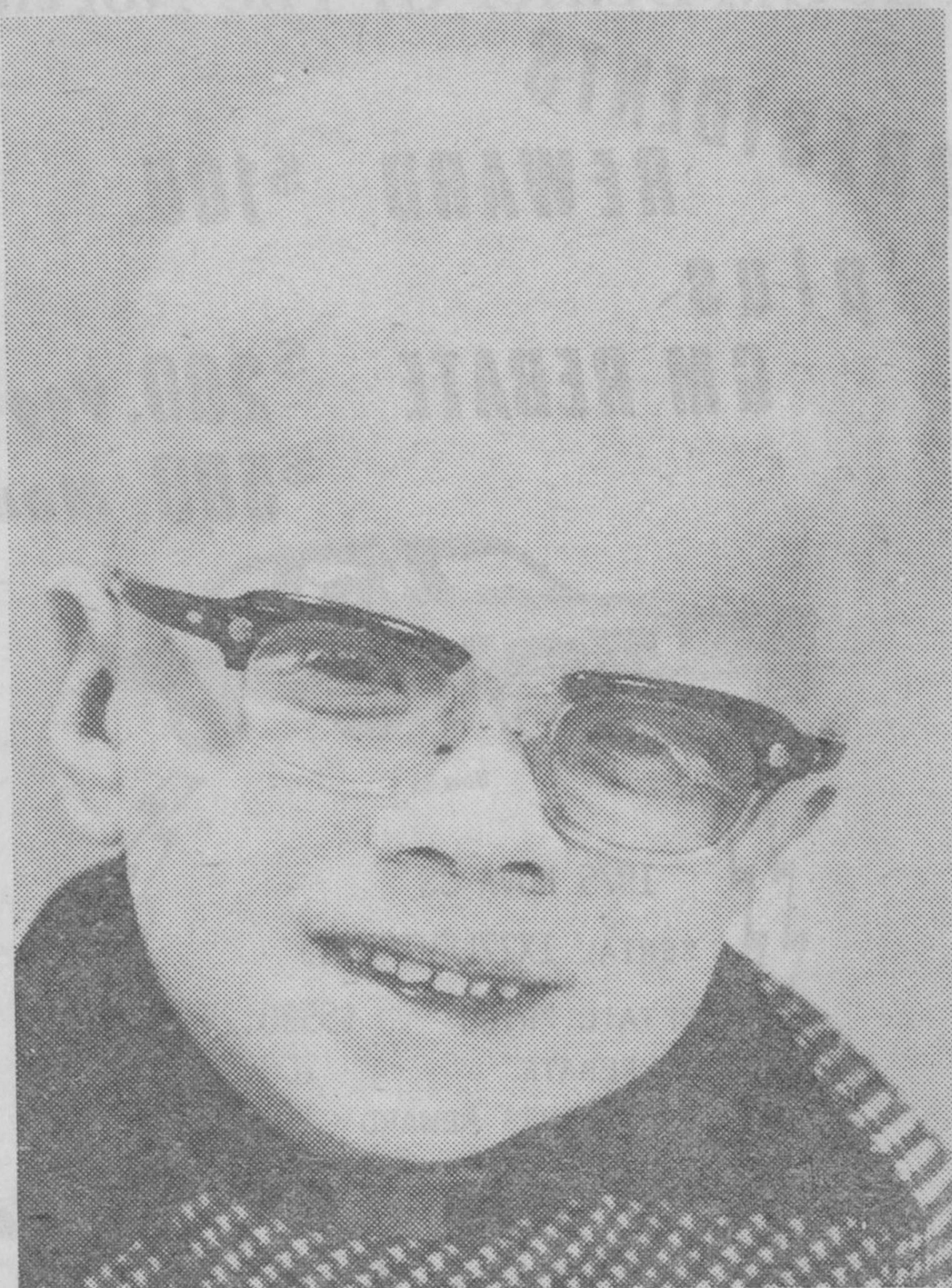
Mr. P. Thompson, new chairman, welcomed the members of the Afternoon Group of the Ladies' Guild to the Community Church.
