

BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING

Tom Pollard, new Terrace Bay Public trustee was introduced to the Board presided by the Chair at the Board of Education held February 22nd in Marathon. Minutes of meeting no. 2/75 held January were declared adopted. The minutes of no. 40 of the Trainable Retarded Child Advisory Committee held January 28th, acknowledged as received. Gary Lieben will be paid \$27.00 per month for secretarial services provided the McMorland School for Trainable Retarded. Mae Chesnick will be paid an Honorarium of \$15.00 per meeting, for secretarial services provided the Trainable Retarded Advisory Committee.

Chair acknowledged from the minutes that Nettbarn's appointment as Chairlady of Advisory Committee for the Trainable Retarded.

Disbursements for the month of January, totalled \$246,244.10.

Financial requirements for 1975-76 are to be met in the near future.

Chairman indicated that the Budget Committee approved 40% expenditure on repairs and capital from the 1975 budget and the request from administration, control of luxury items excepted.

A subcommittee comprising R. Acourt, J. Nugent and J. Nugent is to examine the recommendations from each area on use of school buildings. A final report is expected at the next meeting.

Travel, board and transportation allowances are currently being paid by the Board will be reduced to the new maxima eligible for grant payments, effective January 1, 1975 for T.M. rates: 75 miles or less - \$6.50 per day,

over 75 miles - \$7.25 per day; and for regular students - 75 miles or less - \$5.50 per day; over 75 miles - \$6.25 per day.

All meetings of the Budget Committee, Salary Committee, and Committee of the Whole Board have been declared not open to the public.

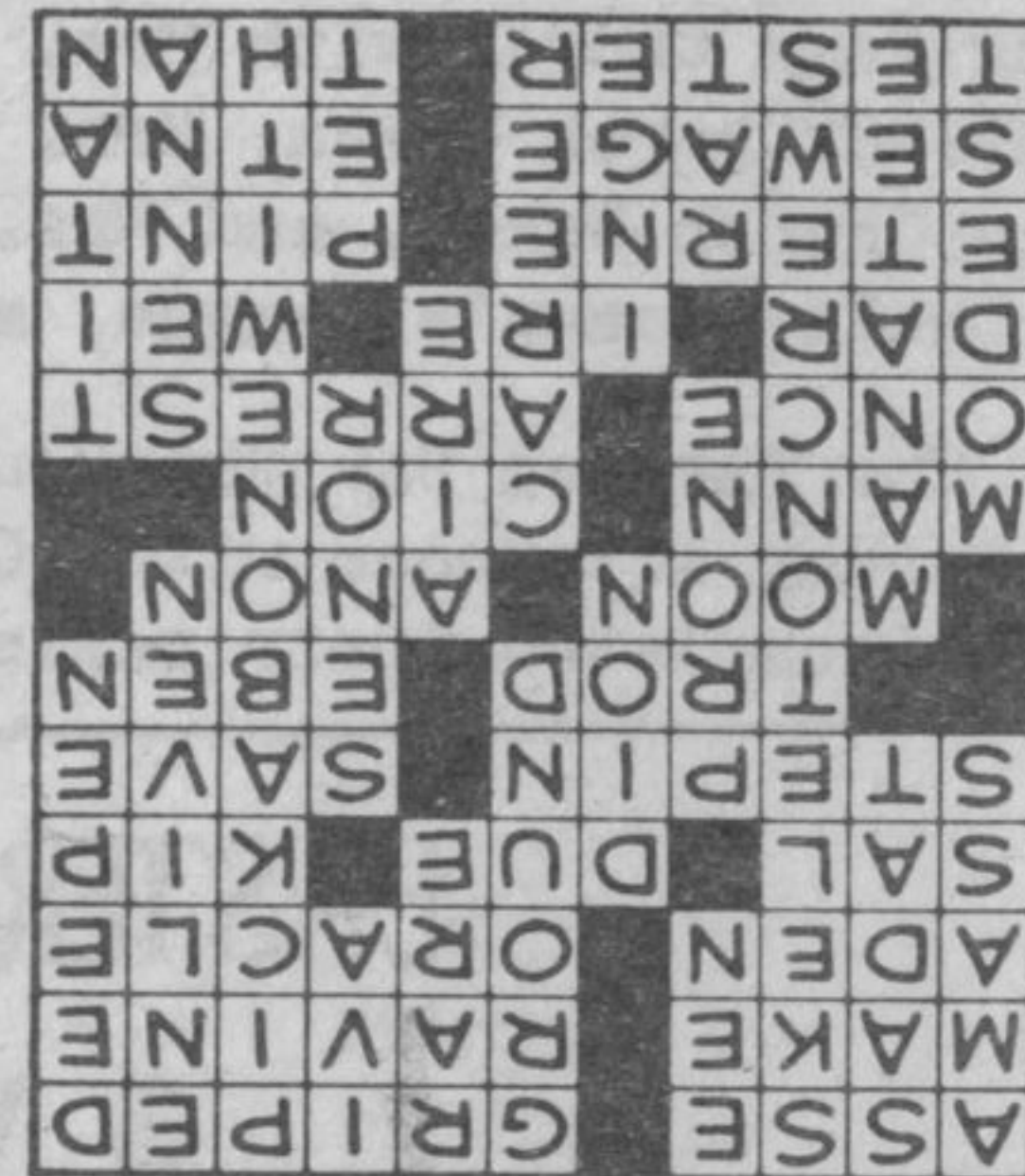
The annual inspection report from the Thunder Bay District Health Unit was received. All recommendations have been acted upon.

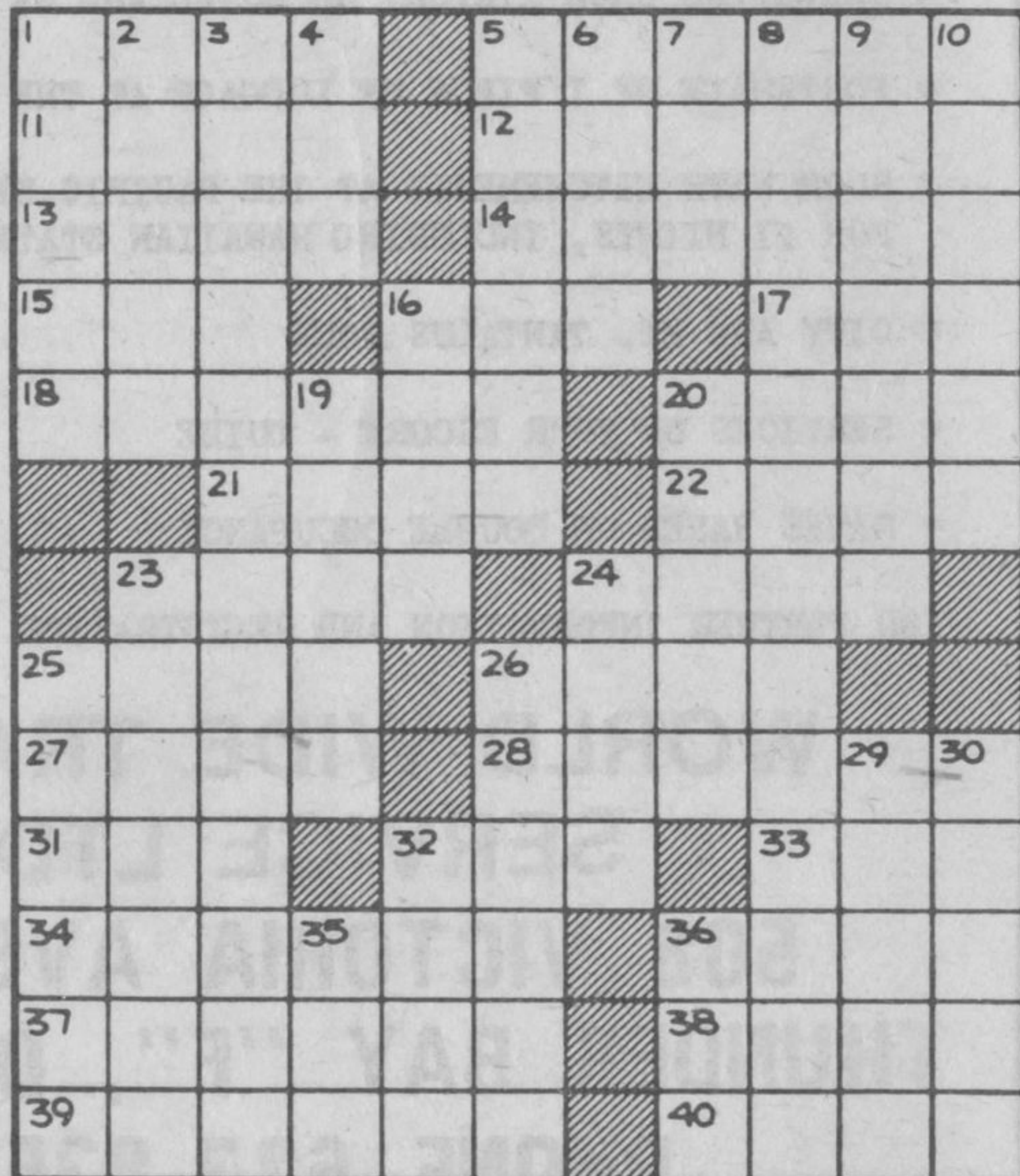
