MOOSE HUNTING SEASONS - 1975

The moose hunting seasons for 1975 will op-
en one week later than last year. In many
areas of Ontario, they will also close earlier.
In the Terrace Bay District the seasons will be
as follows:

- Residents - October 4 - December 15, 1975
- Non-Residents - October 11 - November 15, 1975

The licence fee for residents remains the
same but non-residents will have to pay \$175.00
(up \$50.00) for their 1975 moose licence.
They will also need a \$15.00 Moose Export Per-
mit to take a moose out of Ontario.

A new "primitive weapons" (long bow, cross-
bow, and muzzle loading firearm) area and sea-
son has been established on the Aulneau Pennin-
sula of Lake of the Woods.

Ontario has established a new system of wild-
-life management units, based on the wildlife
resource produced, by land capability and pre-
sent and future use patterns. Boundaries of
all these units are defined by easily recogniz-
ed ground features such as rivers, lakes, roads
railways, pipelines and hydro lines. No long-
er will there be any reason for doubt in the
hunter's mind as to which season zone he is in.

As in the case in 1975, several wildlife
management units may have the same season dates
However, should one unit become a problem area,
we will now be able to modify the season in
that area without changing the seasons else-
where.

are available at our local office.
