Increase in Minimum Wages

The Ministry of Labour of the Ontario Government will increase the minimum rate of pay from \$2.25 to \$2.40 effective May 1st. This rate is effective for all general hourly rated employees and is the minimum wages that employers are required to pay their employees in Ontario.

There are a few exceptions to this rate e.g. construction workers are to receive a minimum of \$2.65 per hour. Those persons hiring on a job with no experience can be classified as a learner for the first thirty days of employment at a rate of \$2.30 per hour.

The student rate of \$2.00 per hour applies to students under eighteen who work during school holidays or who do not work more than
