at 99 per cent efficiency, to reduce odors and other air pollutants. In anticipation of future developments in the bleaching of pulp, a pulp washer of special construction will be built to remove polluting chemicals.

To help evaluate the impact of the development on the entire operating area, Kimberly-Clark retained the services of a Toronto-based firm of environmental consultants. Copies of their environmental assessment report were made available to residents of Terrace Bay and nearby Schreiber prior to the public meeting.
