

GRADE EIGHT CLASS PLANS WALK-A-THON

Grade eight class of St. Martin Separatist is planning their sixth annual Walk-a-thon to raise money for their trip to Toronto. This event will complete the class's fundraising projects for the year.

Each student has been bringing \$10 per month to cover most of the expenses. Additional money has been raised through a bottle drive in January and book sales in March.

In the past few years, the school and the community have eliminated most of the smaller fundraising events that involved bothering people in town. Rather than have a series of bake sales and penny auctions, the students are given the responsibility for raising the majority of the money on their own.

This method has been both successful and popular in past years: the responsibility is placed on the student to look after his own contribution. Most students earn their \$10 per month by sitting or other odd jobs. This door-to-door canvassing for money is kept to an absolute minimum.

Next year the class will have a METRIC CAMPAIGN to acknowledge Canada's switchover to the metric system. The walk-a-thon route

from Terrace Bay to Schreiber and back is 32 kilometres long. It's the same distance as in other years, but it's being measured in kilometres this year instead of in miles. (A kilometre is approximately 5/8 of a mile). The best way to learn metric is to experience it ... and that's what the walkers will be doing this year as they cover the 16 kilometres into Schreiber and (hopefully) the 16 kilometres back to Terrace Bay!

The Walk-a-thon is scheduled for Saturday, May 24th. There will be more information provided in the TERRACE BAY NEWS and over CBQ Radio in the next few weeks. The students are asking for your support again this year in the hope that their walk-a-thon will be as successful as it has been in the past.
