

Clark retained the services of a based firm of environmental consultants of their environmental report available for public inspection at the offices and public libraries of Longlac and Geraldton for review prior to public meetings.

The report outlines in detail what effect the mill expansion will have on the area's wildlife, employment, population, air and water quality, etc.

The mill expansion at Terrace Bay and surrounding lands in Longlac, Geraldton and Nakina represented the largest single capacity project in Kimberly-Clark's history.

To meet all its wood requirements, Kimberly-Clark will harvest an estimated 973,000 cords of wood. Additional timber limits have been granted to the company under Crown licence to cover a combined area of 12,186 square miles.

Mr. Stockett noted that the biggest impact will be felt in Terrace Bay because of the increased mill capacity and in Nakina, which is the main base for cutting in the area. New timber leases in the north. How Longlac and Geraldton will also benefit from the enlarged mill and wood operations.

To accommodate in part the increase in the company's work force, Kimberly-Clark will spend \$6 million on housing facilities in Longlac, Nakina and Terrace Bay. In addition, it will also guarantee housing loans for employees who wish to build their own homes in all communities.
