

SCHREIBER COUNCIL QUOTES

Highlights of Schreiber town council May Meeting: Fire Chief Peter Doig presented an urgent request for the formation of a building committee to ensure that building construction and renovations be done with materials in accordance with the fire underwriters' association

He also requested a fire agreement be drawn up between Ken Dooley and the township for protection of Dooley's property which lies just outside the town line.

Mrs. Dorothy Rummery, reporting for McCausland Hospital Board stated the new quarters for doctors are to be ready for July first.

The Ministry of Environment stated costs in connection with remedial work on town roads will be paid directly to the township.

The Kool Kats Snowmobile Club requested permission to cut a trail, from behind the Club at Walker Lake to the old ski jump in Schreiber adjacent to the Lake Road hill and council is agreeable, with the club to look into ownership of property in the area and make their own arrangements.

The by-law, approved by the Municipal Board was passed, for construction of the new dam at Cooks Lake.

A progress payment of \$40,375.00 was paid to the Scorpio Engineering for work done, to date on the dam, with a hold-back of \$7125.00 on the total cost.
