MOBILE SAILING SCHOOL TO BE OFFERED:

The Terrace Bay Recreation Office is pleased to announce that a Mobile Sailing School will be offered in Terrace Bay to anyone interested. This school is for one week only, July 21st to July 25th. Interested persons may register by dropping down to the Recreation Office to make payment and fill out your form. Fee is as follows: Adults \$18.00; children under 18, \$12.00. This fee includes 15 hours of instruction during the week.

Registrants have the choice of morning, afternoon or evening sessions and it is important to point out that if you wish to change sessions during the week (i.e., shift work, etc.) you are permitted to do so. This fee covers not only the instruction time but also the use of equipment which is provided for you by the school. Anyone interested must sign up by July 18th.
