On the weekend Bill Kujbida and George Dashkewytch were surprised to find some lovely edible mushrooms on the path enroute to their favorite fishing place.

Bill asked the news reporter to find out why mushrooms were growing this time of the year, when usually they were only found in the fall.

Jim Chappel of the Natural Resources, Terrace Bay was very helpful and informed me that Thane Walshe, a Naturalist Botanist from Quetico Park, Thunder Bay had defined them as Morels mushrooms and Chanterelle mushrooms. There is also a 'false Morel' which is poisonous.

A description of these mushrooms is available at the local Public Library.

Any mushrooms found should be checked for edibility before eating.


