Thursday from ten a.m. to three p.m. a meeting was held in the Community Hall of Rossport by the members of the Pays Plat Indian Band when they met with several officials from the Lakehead to discuss housing at the reserve, the building and financing the Snowshoe Factory, the building of a community center and hall and the funding of same.

Chief Gerry Bouchard presided and Edna Wannikamik was secretary. The Chief reported that the logs are cut and peeled and stacked for drying to build the log hall. The architects plans for the hall were viewed and discussed. They planned to complete the basement for fall so that the snowshoe operation can get started thus supplying winter work for the members of the tribe. The upper floor will have a large assembly hall, kitchen, washrooms,

offices, cloak rooms and library. When completed with cupboards, dishes, etc. would run into about \$150,000. A discussion was held on the septic tank and field system and supplying water to the building. A discussion was had on the building of new houses at the reserve and other matters pertaining to the Band-'s problems.

Following the meeting a buffet luncheon was enjoyed convened by Mrs. Cathy Bouchard. A good showing of residents of the band. Chief Bouchard reported that there was a population of around seventy persons on the Pays Plat Band.
