charged with careless driving. Also a minor theft was reported from a local store.

During the evening a motor cyclist tried to out run the Police cruiser by driving across the Community Church lawn. The rider was subsequently charged under the Highway Traffic Act and the Petty Trespass Act.

August I6th - as a result of accidents on Kenogami Road and Highway I7 driver of both vehicles were charged with impaired driving.

During this period a total of four accidents were investigated. One of which involved a child cyclist attempting to cross Highway I7. Children are once again reminded to walk their cycles across the Highway.

Eleven charges were laid under the Highway Traffic Act, five of which consisted of squealing tires. Five charges under the Liquor Control Act were laid and six motor vehicles were safety checked.

As a result of damage to lawns at the Recreation Centre and Centennial Park by motor vehicles (including motor cycles) it is requested that no motor vehicles be driven on these areas. After this week any person driving or operating a motor vehicle on these lawns will be charged under the Petty Trespass Act.

A local by-law forbidding the operation of bikes and motor vehicles on side walks is in force and as a result of complaints charges have already been laid.

From observation it would appear that the worst offenders are adults who show little regard for pedestrians.

Please do not operate your vehicle on side walks.

SEPARATE SCHOOL AMALGAMATION CONSIDERED

Discussions and studies that began in 1974 on the matter of combining four separate school zones in the District of Thunder Bay are quickly becoming a reality. Representatives of the separate school boards of Manitouwadge, Nakina, Nipigon-Red Rock and Schreiber-Terrace Bay met on July 30th in Terrace Bay to arrange for the election of trustees to the new board which will be formed January I, 1976.

The new board will be composed of nine trustees and distribution (based on a formula of equalized assessment) will be as follows:

Manitouwadge - 3 trustees
Terrace Bay - 2 trustees
Schreiber - 1 trustee
Nipigon - 1 trustee
Red Rock - 1 trustee
Nakina - 1 trustee

At this meeting the name of the new board, selected by the Committee and submitted to the Minister of Education for approval, was "The North of Superior Roman Catholic Separate School Board".

Elections for a one-year initial term will be held in each of the communities named, in accordance with The Municipal Elections Act and will take place later in the year.

This new zone will be one of Ontario's geographically largest school zones and will service six schools, educating approximately I,500 elementary students.
