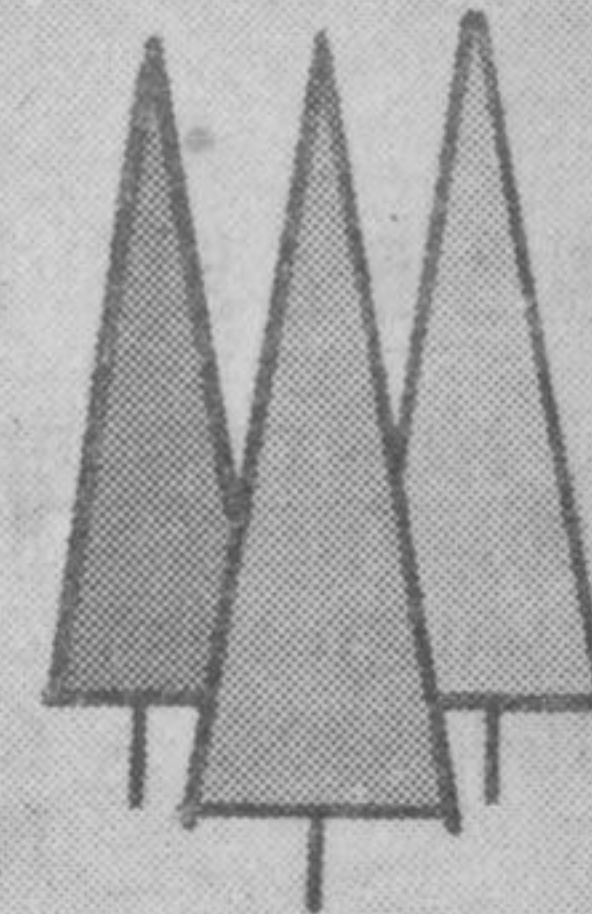

## MEDICAL CENTRE OFFICIALLY OPENED

The new Medical Centre in Schreiber was formally opened on September 5th with a gratifying number of citizens attending despite the heavy rain.

Reeve, Harold McParland said the move to establish such a centre was started by the municipal council when it was realized that to attract and keep a doctor in the town facilities for his work must be improved, but still kept in the centre of the town. The former post office seemed an ideal location.

## TERRACE BAY COUNCIL QUOTES

The regular meeting of Terrace Bay Township Council was held on Wednesday, September 10th with Councillors Brassard, Helmink, Kennedy and Reeve Bray present.

Under correspondence notice was received from J. Yates re the termination of Terrace Bay Taxi effective September 30th.

A request from V. Thompson for paving at the end of his driveway was refused.

A letter from Keith Penner re the proposed Federal Election Boundaries was read.

Fort Frances wrote requesting Terrace Bay Councils endorsement of a resolution concerning land fill sites.

A letter thanking Terrace Bay for its participation and sponsored cocktail hour at the recent Hydro Convention was received from the Schreiber Hydro Electric Commission.

Notice was received from the Ministry of Agriculture and Food re assistance available for a municipal pound program.

Word was received of the Third Annual Northwestern Ontario Recreation Association Fall Conference.

A letter from Costa's re addition to store, relocation of hydro pole and curbing brought forth a resolution from Council outlining all costs must be born by the Foodmarket.

The Ministry of Housing sent word the township's housing policy had been approved.

The Building Inspector's report was read. M. Tardif and W. Aylward advised Council they will be making application to operate a taxi service in town which will be purchased from the present owner.

Accounts passed for payment were: Township \$53,450.73; Hydro \$21,839.15; Library \$1,151.92; Recreation \$17,010.61.
