POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

During the week of October 26th a total of 29 occurrences were investigated.

The theft of stereo tapes from parked vehicles is being investigated.

As reported last week houses on Lakeview Drive had been broken into and damage in the region of \$1700. was committed. Two juveniles were arrested and charged with this offense. During the investigation they admitted a break, enter and theft at a local residence last week where approximately \$150. and a coin collection was stolen. Most of the property was recovered. They also admitted to a number of other break, enter and thefts at residences and business establishments during the past year.

The Police Department apparently set their sights a little too high as the elder of this duo was 13 years of age and the younger 10.

Also on October 20 reports of thefts of newspapers from delivery boys was reported and has resulted in 4 juveniles being interviewed and cautioned.

Again on the 20th, two 13 year olds and a 10 year old were interviewed and cautioned regarding thefts from a local motel.

The theft of a number of radios and clocks was reported and is under investigation.

On October 26th the theft of a Ski-doo trailer was reported. Also on this date a motor vehicle stolen from Thunder Bay was located in Terrace Bay.

3 charges were laid under the Highway Traffic Act, 2 charges were laid under the Liquor Control Act, 9 motor vehicles were safety checked and 6 warnings issued.
