ONTARIO PROVINCIAL POLICE PRESS RELEASE

All motorized snow vehicles have to be registered with the Ministry of Transportation

and Communications.

Your local license office has the permits available at no cost providing you are not operating your snow machine on a highway or public trail. Highways also include your local streets.

Once you obtain your permit your registration number is on the top right corner of the permit and you have to put this number on both sides of your cowling approx. 4 to 6 inches from the rear of the cowling and the numbers can be painted on or adhesive numbers may be used. Numbers have to be in contrast to your machine, example, you can't paint yellow numbers on a yellow cowling. You have to use black, red or another colour that contrasts.

This registration number will remain with your snow machine for the life of the machine. The numbers have to be not less than 2" high and not more than 3" high, brush strokes not less than ½" or more than ½" wide.

If you operate your snow machine on a high-way or public trail you have to have a validated sticker on your machine in addition to the registration number, a driver's license, insurance, attain full age of 16 years and you and your passengers must wear a helmet.
