More than half of the unemployed in the Province are young people. Because of this, the Ontario Government has created a work-experience program, with a living allowance, that is designed to help young job seekers find gainful and

employment.

To be eligible, you must be at least 16 years old, but less than 25 years of age, and you must be unemployed, but actively seeking employment. You must not now be receiving full-time formal education.

Assistance includes on-the-job training plus an allowance of \$100 per week up to a maximum of 52 weeks. The aim is to provide the guidance and experience necessary for employment in private business or industry. The Ontario
