


TERRACE BAY COUNCIL QUOTES

The Township Council met in the Council Chambers on Wednesday, December IOth with W.R. Bray, C. Brassard, J. Hale, P. Helmink and J. Kennedy present.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting were adopted.

Correspondence included letters from: T.E.I.G.A. re Ontario Anti-Inflation Program.

T.E.I.G.A. re restraining I976 spending. T.E.I.G.A. Report on Special Program Review.

A.M.O. re restraints.

Council passed a motion to support the federal governments wage and price control program.

Permission was granted to the Public School to hold a bottle drive on December IOth.

A copy of the letter to the Royal Commission on Power Planning from Reeve Bray was read.

The Building Inspectors Report for November was read.

Under new business accounts passed for pay -ment were: Township - \$54,784.60, Hydro - \$17,046.46, Library - \$1,149.36, Recreation - \$14,700.34.

A rate of \$3.50 was set for snow removal of the preferred driveway list (fireman, doctors, police, etc.)

Councillor Kennedy presented a motion to have the \$3000.00 in the fire budget put in a reserve account as it will not be used this year. This motion was passed.

Councillor Helmink brought to Councils attention the recent rent increase on a town wned house is 22% and asked this be reduced comply with wage and price controls and ly be increased by I0%.
