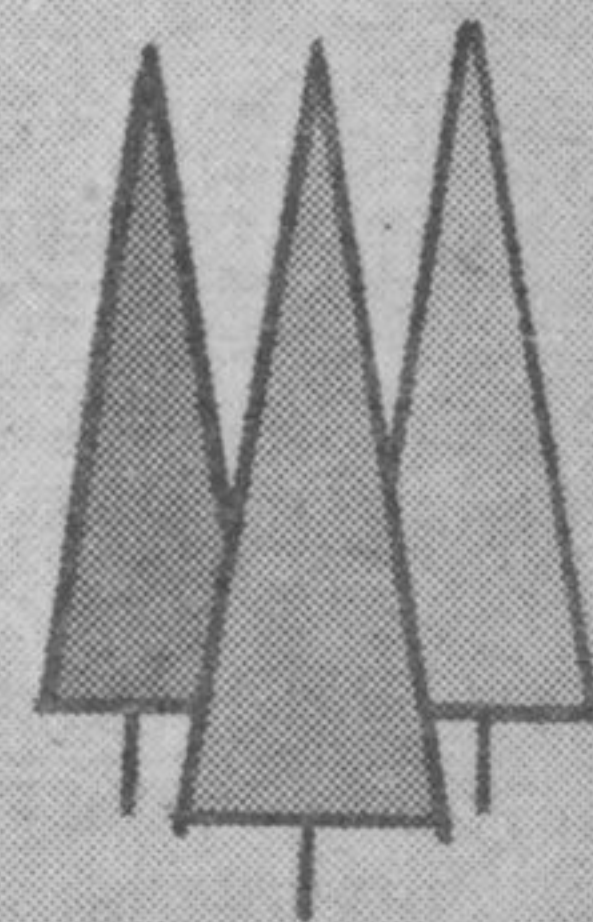

DISTRICT HOME FOR THE AGED MEETING

The District Board of Management held their meeting at Pinewood Court on January 9th. This was due to the December meeting being delayed as the Administrator was in Toronto in relation to the 1976 Budget.

Operating accounts totalling \$90,823.83 were passed for November and Capital accounts totalling \$11,207.37 were approved.

The Administrator reported on the December 19th meeting in Toronto where the Minister of Community and Social Services, Mr. Taylor, the Deputy Minister, Mrs. Crittenden and the Director of Senior Citizens' Homes for Ontario, Mr. Crawford set out guidelines to be followed by the Homes for 1976. The main points being that the Operating budget would be restricted to 5.5% increase over 1975's expenditures, salary and wage increases limited to 8%, the Federal guidelines. The new expenditures for Capital would not be approved. The Minister, Mr. Taylor will be in Thunder Bay on January 20th to further explain the guidelines to Board and Committee members.

Texaco Canada Limited was the lowest of five tenders. They will supply fuel oil to Birchwood Terrace Home for 1976 at a price of 37.5¢ a gallon. The other bidders were Imperial Oil at 37.6¢, Shell at 38.35¢, Gulf Oil at 38.9¢ and Husky Oil at 39.8¢. The oil is delivered by tank truck.

The Board approved the rent increase to tenants in Birchwood Terrace by 8%. New signs at the East and West extremities of the Homes property at Birchwood were authorized and will be erected in the spring. Highway people have approved the signs. Thorne Riddell & Co. were appointed auditors to review the records for 1975 of both Homes, Pinewood Court and Birchwood Terrace. Cont'd page 2.....
