Discussion took place concerning trips involving students and teachers but not sponsored by the Board. It was felt that guidelines for such non-sponsored trips which involve Board employees should be laid down.

A report from Mr. Pappas concerning problems in the new addition in the Marathon Public School was distributed. The Business Administrator reported that he had been in touch with the architect and that a plumber was now dealing with the problems. Mr. Talarico indicated that he too had been looking into these problems, and he suggested that an outside plumber be present on the site while the source of the existing problem was being traced.

The Board decided to pay an individual to supervise the inspection of the plumbing at the Marathon Elementary School and report on the cause of the problem on Jan. 20 at the discretion of Mr. D. Talarico.
