HOSPITAL HIGHLIGHTS

The January meeting of the McCausland Hospital Board was held Tuesday the 20th at the Lake Superior High School - Schreiber Campus. Ten members were present.

The Minutes of the regular December 16, 1975, Board meeting were accepted as circulated.

The Nurses' contracts are being reviewed. Full time Nurses' contracts were received and signed. The part time Nurses' contracts are yet to be received.

Mrs. Jan McEwen elaborated on Property Rezoning. The rezoning of the area selected for the new hospital was not opposed by the residents in the prescribed area. This property has been determined by our Consulting Engineers to be an ideal site for our new hospital.

As a further step towards the development of the new hospital - Mrs. McEwen, together with the Board's Architect, Mr. John Petersmeyer, is compiling a brief profile on each department of the hospital for submission to the Ministry of Health.

Construction of the new hospital is expected to be completed by February 1978. (Eighteen months from beginning of construction).

Mrs. Betty Usher, the new Representative of the Hospital Auxiliary to the Board, was welcomed by the Board Chairman.

NOTICE

Effective immediately the Strand Theatre will be forced to enforce the following Theatre Act:

THE THEATRES ACT

PERSONS UNDER TWELVE YEARS ATTENDING THEATRES

23.- (1) No person apparently under twelve years of age not accompanied by a person apparently sixteen years or more of age shall be permitted to purchase a ticket of admission or be granted admission to an exhibition of moving pictures in a theatre,

- (a) after the hour of 7:30 p.m. on any day;
- (b) during the school term of public and high schools in the municipality in which the theatre is situated, except,
 - (1) during school holidays between the hours of 9 a.m. and 7:30 p.m., and
 - (11) during any other day during the term between the hours of 3:30 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. 1960-61, c.99, s.11 (1).

which means that the only shows that children under 12 can attend are the Friday and Saturday first shows and matinees.
