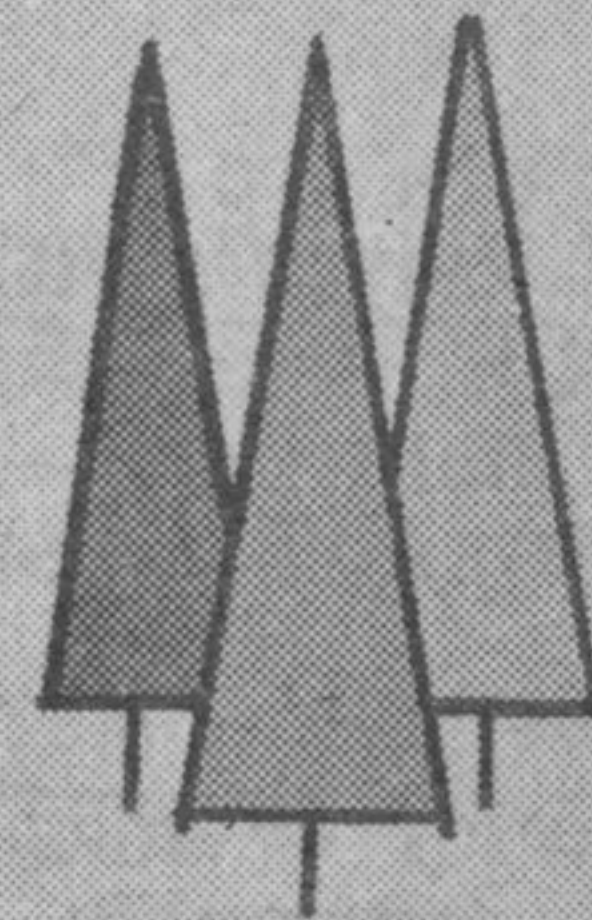

BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING

At the regular meeting of the Board of Education held on February 16, 1976 the following matters were of interest and were dealt with:

The Rent Control which has now been established has not yet been able to confirm whether or not the rents for the houses and apartment buildings owned by this Board come under Bill 20 or not.

There is a great need for additional space in the Industrial Arts Shop in Manitowadge High School. The Board has already made a proposal to the Ministry for an extension to that shop but, because of the grant restraints being imposed, approval has not yet been received from the Ministry of Education.

A Work-Study Symposium on Professional Development, which is being run by O.I.S.E. in conjunction with the Ministry of Education, is being held in Thunder Bay on April 11th - 14th and will be attended by the Director and one Principal.

The Architect, Mr. R. J. Graham, reported in a letter that the deficiencies at Marathon Public School were being looked after satisfactorily.

An excellent and valid Night School Program is being run in the communities of Manitowadge, Marathon, Schreiber and Terrace Bay. Thirty courses are currently being run catering to 1150 students in these communities.

Before Apartment Building No. 2 in Manitowadge can be sold, additional land adjacent to the building must be acquired by the Board in order to comply with the zoning By-Laws.

The Board expressed its sympathy for the family of Mr. Glenn Welton. Mr. Welton was Vice-Principal in Marathon Public School and a teacher there since 1949.
