TERRACE BAY ARENA - FUME PROBLEM:

For the past 2½ weeks, the Recreation Department has been doing its best to resolve the fume problem in the arena. During the above-mentioned period of time, the ice resurfacer has been utilized on a restricted basis with the old flood tank system being kept on standby in case the accumulation of fumes in the arena gets too great.

The front entrance doors have been kept open during the course of Arena Schedule programmes, allowing some air movement to take place in the arena. We would ask for the cooperation of those using the arena by not closing the entrance doors when entering or leaving the arena.

Since the Terrace Bay arena has no adequate ventilation system, arrangements are underway to attempt to install a fan system which would enable air contained within the arena to be exhausted to the outside.

We wish to assure the general public that the Recreation Department is doing all possible to solve this problem. We would request your consideration and patience in this matter.
