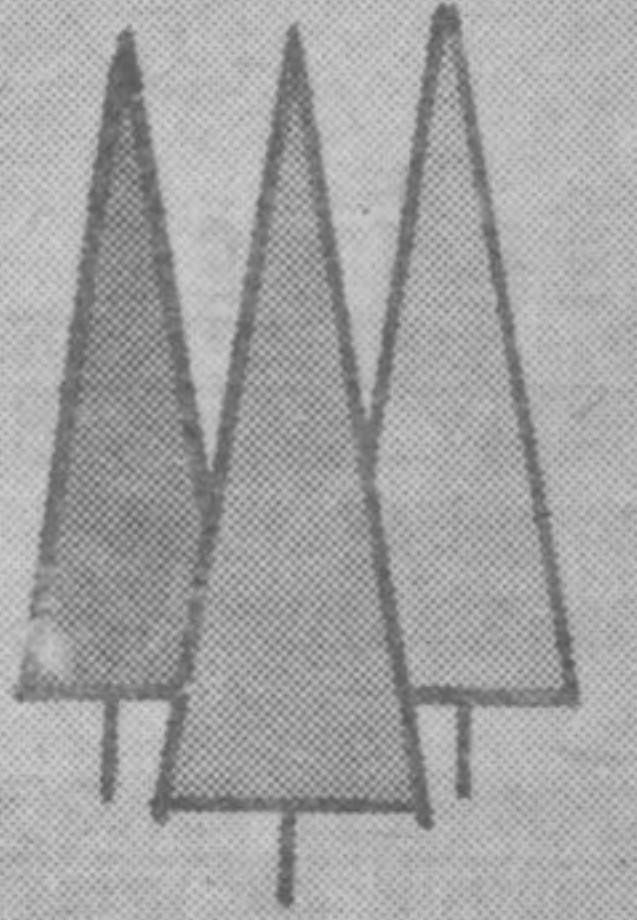

NAME OF BOARD OFFICIALLY APPROVED

The North of Superior Combined R.C. Separate School Board held their second regular meeting on Saturday, February 21, 1976 at the Holy Angels School in Schreiber.

Sr. Marcel Belfry introduced the staff to the members of the Board and Mr. J. Bunkis, Chairman of the Board, introduced Board members to staff. At the conclusion of the meeting, members of the Board were conducted on a tour of the school by the staff.

During the business session of the meeting, the Board:

- i) received a letter from the Minister of Education, the Honourable Thomas L. Wells, giving official approval for the name of the Board and wishing the trustees success in their new challenge.
- ii) accepted a schedule for the determination of expense allowances.
- iii) discussed a report from the management committee describing possible sites for the location of Board offices.
- iv) approved a monthly charge of \$2,500.00 for administrative services to the Geraldton District R.C.S.S. Board.
- v) discussed a programme of assessment review and referred the question to the finance committee for study.
- vi) accepted, with regret, the resignation of Mrs. Marjorie Stephen.
- vii) approved payment of January Bills.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:05 p.m.
