





More than 500 people toured Kimberly-Clark's new recreation complex during an open house held April 25. The public was invited to wander through the pre-fabricated facility and make use of equipment in the games room and the mini-gym. A hobby crafts workshop area and a snack bar are also incorporated in the building and Kimberly-Clark has applied for a license for the complex.

Built on the construction site for the exclusive use of the construction camp residents, the complex will alleviate the strain that could be imposed on the town's recreational facilities as the construction work force increases to nearly 1,000 by mid-summer.

Approximately 450 construction trades people are now on the site of the mill expansion.

Accomodation on the site, consisting of prefabricated units, is now available for 600 construction personnel with accommodation for an additional 400 people to be completed by early summer.
