MILL RATE INCREASE

At a special meeting of the Council of the Township of Terrace Bay held on May 3rd, the 1976 mill rates for MUNICIPAL purposes were approved and will be adopted at a regular meeting to be held on May 12th.

The Municipal Commercial Mill Rate increased by 1.716 mills.

The Municipal Residential Mill Rate increased by 1.459 mills.

Municipal property taxes will increase by \$14.59 over 1975 taxes on a residential assessment of \$10,000. and by \$17.51 on a residential assessment of \$12,000.

As soon as the Education mill rates are received tax bills will be printed with an anticipated date for payment of first instalment of June 28, 1976.
