INFORMATION ONTARIO - BY BEV YOUNG TAX ON MEALS

As of April 7, 1976 the price of prepared meals was increased to \$5.00 from the previous \$4.00.

This means that tax is not applicable to the sale price of a prepared meal of \$5.00 or less. Tax at the rate of 10% must be charged on meals over \$5.00.

Where each person is given a separate bill, it is the total charge (excluding liquor, beer, or wine) which determines whether the charge is taxable, or exempt.

The meals for several persons are often recorded on one bill. When this occurs, the number of persons served must be shown on the bill and if the average price per person is \$5.00 or less tax does not apply. If the average price per person is over \$5.00 tax of 10% applies to the total amount of the bill.

Charges for liquor, beer or wine must always be shown separately at the total taxed at 10%.
